"How I survived lockdown" - Our First Online Event

Her Centre held its first open forum on Zoom on the 3rd December, with 35 attendees and a wide range of presentations including two films. Denise Hubble from Deborah Ubee Trust counselling service spoke on looking after ourselves during lockdown and most of our other presentations were from women who had experienced domestic abuse and could now share their more positive life free from abuse. The links to lockdown and living with an abuser are similar and were discussed in our film Brave New World where Tanasha shared her journey from leaving abuse to taking up volunteering and studying to be a counsellor.

Cassie raised the challenges of support for mothers in the court where their children's father is abusive, and she is now studying law to be able to help change this in the future. She also ran the half marathon to support Her Centre last year. Laura shared her holiday snaps from her caravan and Suzie shared her lockdown poem.

We showed the earlier and longer film, Unlocking Huger in Lockdown, which shows how GCDA who lead on addressing food poverty in Greenwich were working with Clockhouse, Her Centre and Woolwich Common Community Centre to distribute food to families in need. Future Films

They received gifts for their children, a small gift for mum and then food treats for the holiday period. Over 160 people benefited from the goodie bags last Saturday the 19th December. We look forward to next year when we can offer hot food and games as well as Santa's grotto along with the presents for families.

IRIS Training

Her Centre, working with Public Health, the CCG and Greenwich Safer Communities, is jointly running a series of nationally developed training for GP surgeries on addressing domestic abuse. The training is based on the national IRIS (Identification and Referral to Improve Safety) programme, which is co-delivered by Her Centre staff and two Clinical leads who are local GPs, Jaisun Vivekanandaraja and Mariyam Aqeel. It gives the key information to support surgeries to identify and refer victims to safety and following the training GPs can refer directly to Her Centre any cases of abuse for follow up support and advocacy.

We launched the training last week, with St Marks being the first surgery in Greenwich to receive it. Feedback was very positive!

Weekly One Stop Shop for Women Experiencing Abuse

Her Centre runs a weekly one-to-one drop-in offering practical, emotional, and legal support to women affected by abuse.

The service is free and confidential with advisors from the Her Centre, and Solicitor Angela Simpson from Hudgell & Partners.
